Annual Awards to Honor USMA 1958 Graduates

- Lawrence M. Malone Award. A trophy awarded to the outstanding cadet in the Georgetown ROTC Ranger Challenge Team Competition. John Herren has arranged with the 1968 Georgetown ROTC class, taught by Larry, to sponsor and fund the Award.
- Walker Award. Presented annually at the Department of Social Sciences in honor of George
 Walker. The class contributed \$8,000 for a plaque, suitable recognition of George and an annual
 award of books to the winning cadets. The endowment is managed by the Military Academy
 Corps of Cadets Fund.
- The Brigadier General James Ramsden Award in Chemistry was established by Jack Downing, endowed through a private collection, and is administered by the USMA Department of Chemistry and Life Sciences. An engraved silver plate is awarded annually to the outstanding graduating cadet in Chemistry. Perpetual funding will continue through the Military Academy Corps of Cadets Fund.
- <u>The Brigadier General Anthony A. Smith Award for Excellence in Foreign Studies</u> was established and funded in perpetuity by the George and Carol Olmsted Foundation. Each year, engraved pewter plaques are presented to two cadets who have demonstrated outstanding character and exemplary leadership one cadet having participated in the Semester Abroad program and the other in the Cultural Immersion Program.
- The Captain Gerald C. Capelle Memorial Trophy. For excellence in intramural competition at the United States Army Military Academy Preparatory School. Sponsored by the West Point Class of 1958, the Capelle Trophy is awarded in honor of Captain Capelle, who was killed in action in Vietnam on 1 April 1965. The Trophy is awarded to the Cadet Company achieving the best performance in the physical domain and on the fields of friendly strife. The Trophy is endowed.
- The General William G. T. Tuttle, Jr. USA (Ret) Award for Business Acumen in Defense and Government was established in 2000 at the Center of Excellence in Logistics and Technology by the Institute of Defense and Business. Awards have been made annually to recipients across the logistics spectrum of the U.S. Department of Defense and the U.S. Coast Guard. The class bears no responsibility for associated costs.
- W. E. Serchak Astronomy Award, administered by the USMA Department of Physics & Nuclear Engineering and presented to a cadet who demonstrates academic excellence, scientific passion, and leadership. Established in 2023, this Award is funded in perpetuity. The selected Cadet receives a mounted Cadet Saber with a plaque on the mount denoting the name of the awardee, the year, and the name of the award. Accompanying the saber is a 5-year subscription to Astronomy Magazine.
