<u>Memorial Articles:</u> The "3d Special Initiative," which has been posted on our Class website by Bill Serchak. This initiative gathers together the guidelines, suggestions and recommendations for making easier for our survivors the task of writing Memorial Articles. "In Lieu of Flowers...": Frequently survivors are faced with a decision regarding an alternative to flowers as a means of memorializing the departed. Death notices often designate a specific Charity or a Memorial Fund as appropriate "In Lieu of flowers..." The Class Executive Committee would like to suggest that we all consider designating either the 1958 Class Fund, or the Class of 1958 Perpetual Endowment Fund "...in Lieu of Flowers." Such a decision could have a beneficial impact on both funds if you consider that over 300 of us each represent approximately \$100 from the class memorial fund at the time of our passing into the Long Grey Line. It is important to inform your next of kin of such a decision, preferably in writing.

<u>Class Flags</u>: We now have three class flags which should ease some of the pressure getting proper coverage of funerals and memorial services in the future. Just to review, when it is learned that a <u>Classmate</u> has died, the Company CCQ should attempt to get firm information from the family or a responsible representative concerning funeral and memorial plans. The ExCom will assist the CCQ in trying to contact a classmate likely to attend the funeral to ask that he receive and deploy the class flag on behalf of us all. We have had some requests for the flag for wives' ceremonies and have been able to honor those requests since there were no competing requests for <u>Classmate</u> ceremonies. The Flag, less the flag staff and Reunion Streamers, is sent by overnight mail (paid for by TK Smith's commercial account – Thanks TK). We have had great success getting the flag to these events, <u>provided we get timely notification</u>. Sincere thanks to all who have performed this important duty for the class. (**Dale Hruby**)

ExCom Meeting – 22 April 2010: The minutes of the April 22 meeting of the Executive Committee have been posted on the Class Web Site by Pete Trainor. The main item of discussion was the six week experiment in limiting the volume of communications in the class Forum. The committee had previously agreed to conduct a six week test limiting each participant in the class Forum to two messages per day. At the end of the test period, the CCQs were asked to poll their company mates concerning this trial. A plurality (54 out of 141 respondents) of those responding voted to discontinue all restrictions and the Executive Committee accordingly concluded the test by removing all restrictions. It was further agreed that alternatives to the E-Mail format should be explored to consider other Forum packages (software and hardware) that may meet our needs better than the current model. An ad hoc technical committee will be selected and chaired by Dale Hruby to address the issue.

# Enclosure #1: WOUNDED WARRIOR MENTOR PROGRAM (WWMP) UPDATE

In 2004, a small group on DC-based '58 classmates led by Lee Miller, Bob Tredway, John Herren and Pete Brintnall determined there was a need to establish a Wounded Warrior Mentor Program to counsel and assist wounded warriors and their families. The program was designed to get them going down a path to meet self-defined goals to a new productive life and profession, projecting a time frame of three to five years. This, in turn, led to the founding of the "Class of 58 Wounded Warrior Mentor Program". The pillars of our WWMP are education, internships and jobs both in the federal government and corporate world, as well as the maximization of benefits to the wounded warrior and his family. Initially, mentors recruited from local '58 volunteers served the wounded warriors at Walter Reed. From that beginning, the WWMP has continued to grow and evolve in scope, mentoring resources, and participation. As of December 2009, we now have over 300 trained combat officers and senior NCO's mentoring over 400 wounded warriors at Walter Reed. Bethesda Naval and Ft Belvoir with 50 additional wounded warriors in our Follow-On Mentor Program around the country. We have evolved into a dynamic program to assist wounded warriors of all services and genders with mentors from all academies and services, including those from 27 USMA classes. Our WWMP has support within DoD, including Admiral Mullen, CJCS, and the Army, Marine and Air Force commands we serve. We have received many requests to assist other DoD organizations and provide outreach to them with our program serving as an emulation model using our functional structure, concepts, processes and lessons learned. There are currently WWMP programs existing or underway at seven outreach installations. Our WWMP provides support to these outreach programs by initially briefing the chain of command and case managers, then training the initial group of mentors to help these programs get off the ground.

An essential part of the WWMP is to identify follow-on mentors who can step in when the wounded warriors return home after separation. Many feel lost and abandoned during this dramatic change period and the follow-on mentor assumes a key role as these warriors reorient to their new life circumstances. A database has been established to track volunteers who remain "mentors in waiting" until a wounded warrior is identified who will be residing in the area. Wounded warriors being separated are queried on their interest in a follow-on mentor. If so, the follow-on mentor will then be identified and trained by Dick Buckner '61, who coordinates the Follow-On Mentor Program. He will provide information on the wounded warrior and coordinate the hand-off from the primary mentor to the follow-on mentor. A request for follow-on mentors was made at the Tucson mini and 15 classmates signed on to be either a follow-on mentor or to be a leader for the program in their local area. Several classmates have been follow-on mentors and have done an outstanding job in assisting the wounded warrior and his family on the last leg in the path to their personally set goals. In doing so, they have made a significant impact in the lives of the wounded warriors they have mentored.

An ongoing need exists for geographically dispersed follow-on mentors. We hope that more classmates will step up to this worthwhile and rewarding effort.
