Enclosure #3: First Class Club - Update

Our class gift to West Point continues to play a significant and highly popular role in the social life of the First Class. We have been receiving regular reports of its success from Brad Johnson and Munge Moore, Army football season ticket holders who selflessly arrange their travel so as to frequent the First Class Club (FCC) on Friday nights before the game. There are so dedicated to the class that they even stay to close the Club when they are there. (Heck of a long way to go for free beer, guys!)

The only shortcoming of the FCC is its capacity. The Club can accommodate a maximum of 250 persons or thereabouts. On peak nights (Fridays during football season, Thursdays otherwise), cadets are literally four deep at the bar waiting to buy their pitchers.

We have been talking to the Director of Cadet Activities (DCA) about the possibility of enclosing the patio at the Club to allow its use during cold and/or inclement weather. We have a proposal from a vendor for a retractable glass enclosure. I've been to see the product in operation on a roof top lounge in an upscale New York City hotel, and it's pretty nifty. Being able to use the patio year-round would add another 200+ people to the capacity of the FCC. We have not finished negotiating price, but I think we're looking at somewhere in a range of \$200,000 to \$225,000. Considering that their first proposal came in slightly north of \$297,000, we're making good progress.

I need to dot some i's and cross some t's before we are ready to close the deal. We'll need the Director of Public Works to agree to take care of a small amount of prep work that is the owner's responsibility. I want to make sure that the DCA is firm in putting in space heaters and an outside bar, as he has agreed to do. Also, the NY State Historical Office has to agree to let us modify this historically-protected building (we have a preliminary agreement from them).

The class will have to raise some money for this much needed enhancement of the FCC. We have some cash (approximately \$26,000) in our class gift fund. There is also a provision in the By-Laws of the Perpetual Endowment Fund that would allow us to draw up to \$100,000 for enhancements of the FCC if the class gift fund is exhausted.

The class By-Laws call for a class vote on any major expenditure of class funds. Please indicate your approval by responding to the Resolution below NLT 10 Dec 2011. Send your response by snail mail or email to John Raymond, Executive Committee Vice Chairman and Secretary. To facilitate response by email, a separate message has been sent out by email from John. Then at class luncheon at Army/Navy Country Club today I asked for show of hands for those who had read it. About half the group raised hands (about 20 of the 40 or so attendees). Some asked how to get there to read it... I promised Goat Spec on how to do it. Here goes:

However you get to internet, you want to go to http: //:www.westpointaog.org. (sorry this did not become a link -- this digitally-challenged Scribe does not know how to do that when it does not happen automatically. And this one did not.) Type it in and go.

On the right side of AOG web page you can point and click on "Read Class Notes." If you do this, you will get info that says your "Login" is required.

Back to AOG web page and near the top right is Click Here to Login or Sign Up. Point to it and click it.

Now you need your "User ID" and a "password." "User ID" is your Cullum number. Enter it and your password and click "Login." If you did this correctly, you are good to go. On right side of screen you can now click Read Class Notes -- next screen gives decades of class notes. In case you have forgotten, you want to click on 1958 first. Read 180th Column. Back to this page and click on other classes whose notes you want to read.

BUT, if you have forgotten your password click on "Forgotten Password." Try this before registering as a new user. You may have established one and truly forgotten it. Tomorrow AOG will send your password or tell you that you are not registered.

If you KNOW you have never had a password, you can click on "New User Registration" and AOG will get back to you tomorrow during business hours via email and take care of the problem.

The class of 2008, with whom we have a special close relationship, will celebrate its 50th graduation anniversary. All of which makes 2058 a special year.
