No matter who won the weekend, it's an established fact that First Company won the **summer** going away!!

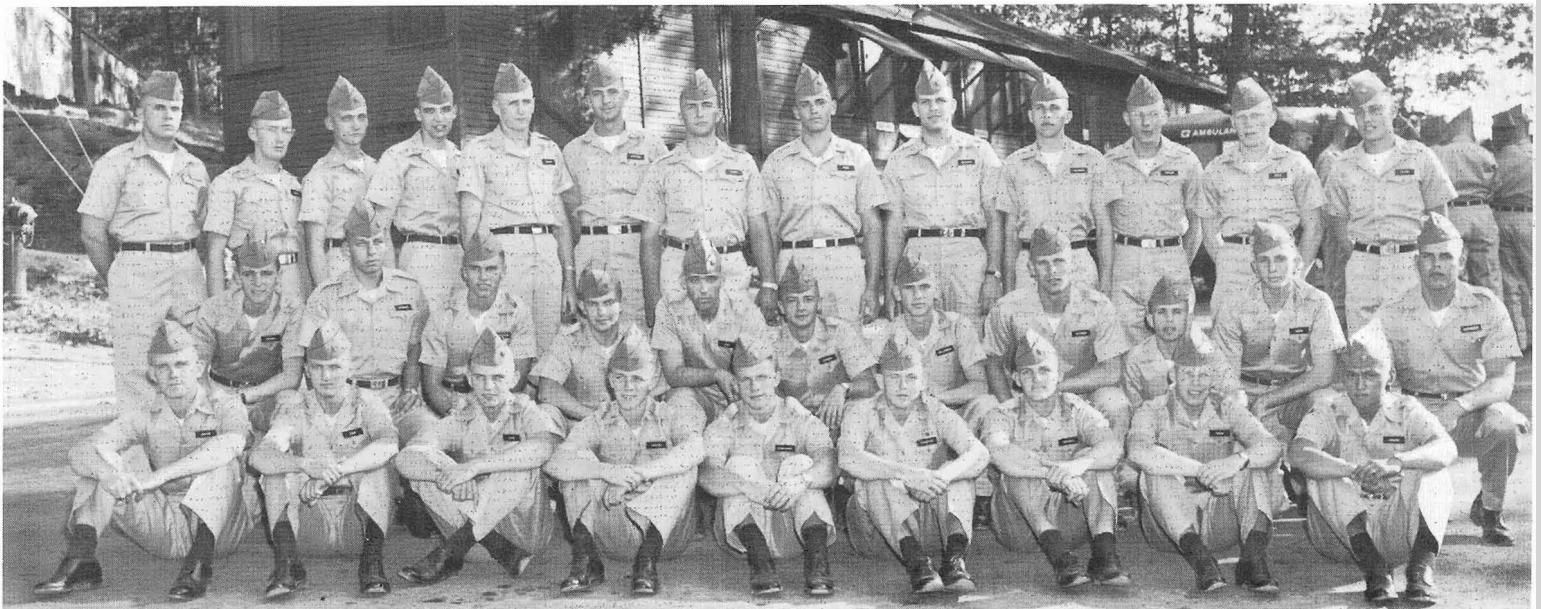
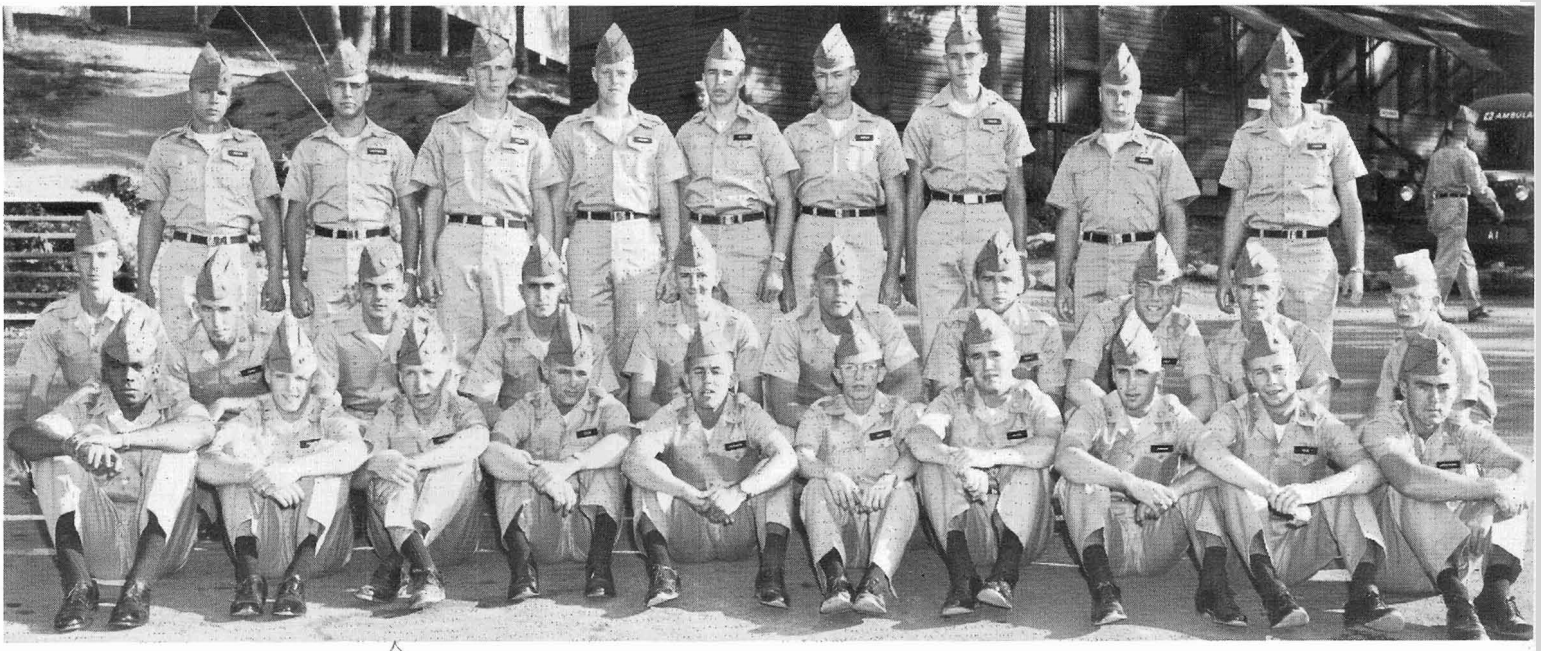
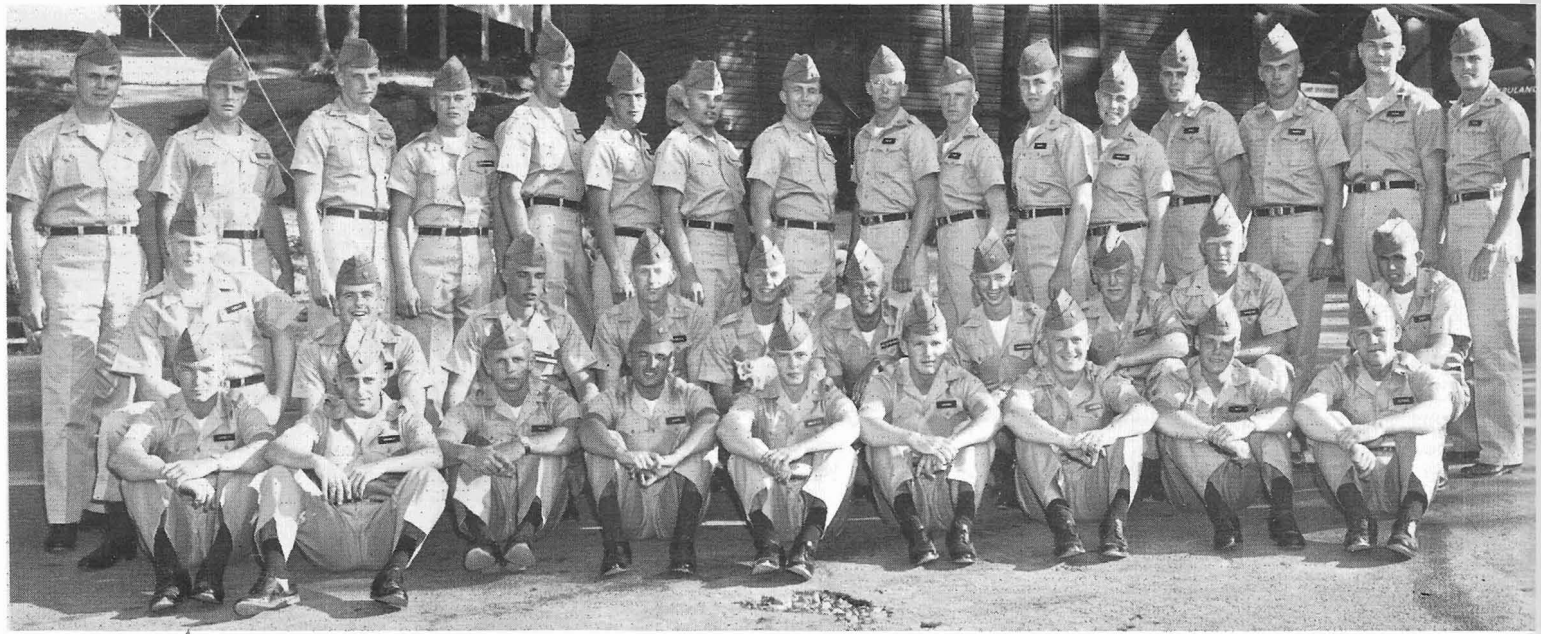
