It is daunting work, but it's a true labor of love.

Did you know that WP-ORG will never charge you or your family to add photographs to the web pages of deceased graduates? Classmates and/or family may send us any image(s) they wish to have included on the home page. We are more than happy to do this as a service to our graduates.

When I came to WP-ORG as a plebe mother in 1998, I knew nothing of West Point and only a spattering about those who were educated there. To say my life has become richer is an understatement. As one of the 2.5 employees, my day often starts at or before 7 AM. I have no regular office hours, therefore, I can often be found writing or speaking to someone late in the evening or early morning with a call from a graduate trying to establish an on-line connection with family and friends through email accounts, email lists, blogs, or web sites. Working from home allows for, and requires, a great deal of flexibility, but the benefit, is that I am always available, or, in the rare event I am not, I can quickly respond, no matter the day of the week.
