Elizabeth D. Samet, Professor of English, currently directs the plebe literature course (EN102); she also teaches in the Department of English and Philosophy's electives program. Samet is the author of Willing Obedience: Citizens, Soldiers, and the Progress of Consent in America, 1776-1898 (Stanford), and Soldier's Heart: Reading Literature Through Peace and War at West Point (FSG), one of The New York Times's 100 Notable Books of 2007, and winner of that year's Los Angeles Times Book Prize for Current Interest. Samet's work has also appeared in the New York Times Magazine, the New Republic, and The American Scholar.

LTC Thomas Rider – "Fortress West Point in the American Revolution"- Eisenhower Hall LTC Thomas Rider is an Assistant Professor in the Department of History and a veteran of the War in Iraq. He received his undergraduate degree in history from West Point and earned a masters degree from the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill. He teaches the core military history course and has taught numerous electives on military and American history during his two tours of duty at West Point. His research interests include the American Revolution and war in the 18th century to include the science of fortification warfare and logistics.
