USMA CLASS OF 1958 PERPETUAL ENDOWMENT.

50th Anniversary Gift: The Class Executive Committee recently established the goal to increase the value of the Endowment to \$580,000 by the 50th anniversary of our graduation. A suggested donation was not set; however, if every living Classmate were to contribute an additional \$900 to the fund over the next six years, the Class goal would be attained. At our 50th, the Supe will be presented with a very large (in physical size - - 1.5 feet by 4 feet) check, dated 4 June 2058, (note date carefully) in the amount of 25 percent of the Endowment's "2058" estimated value - - calculated at an annual growth rate of 8 percent. If we succeed in this campaign, our \$580,000 will grow to \$27.2 million in 2058. Therefore, our check to the Supe would be in the amount of \$6.8 million! And the best part is, our Class will continue to "give" every ten years, most likely at increasing contribution levels.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION.

PLEBE MARCHBACK PLANS. Registration for this year's marchback (13 Aug) has closed. We have ten 58ers marching this August. They are; Collett, Ward, Brinson, Lawton, LeTowt, Ace Peck, H. Morgan, T. Bauer, Sibert, and Weckel. Wish us well.

Ed Weckel has provided several alerts about plans for the 50th Anniversary Marchback in 2004. Our goal is to have at least one marcher from each cadet company. At the 13 mile point, George Sibert will lead us in a memorial service to honor our deceased classmates and our deceased spouses. Thus far 20 classmates have indicated a desire to participate in the 2004 marchback.

TRIP TO NORMANDY 2004. Tom Morgan and Dick Schonberger are planning to organize a trip to Normandy. Tom Morgan has made several trips to Normandy individually (the 40th and 50th Anniversaries) and has led groups there. Dick Schonberger led a large group of World War II 101st Airborne Veterans to Normandy for the 50th Anniversary Commemorations in 1994. 2004 is the 60th Anniversary year of D-Day and we would avoid the large crowds and suffocating French security restrictions by visiting there before D-Day in mid-April 2004. The Landing Beaches and other places familiar to audiences of such films as ***The Longest Day***, ***Saving Private Ryan***, and ***Band of Brothers*** will be visited. Part of the trip would include a visit to Mont St. Michel in Brittany, and a return to Paris via Saumur and the Loire Valley famous for its *chateaux*. The trip will be scheduled so as not to conflict with any other known Class activities.

PROSTATE CANCER SUPPORT GROUP. At the first of this year Bob Tierney and Stan Bacon, with a lot of help from John Brinson, started up the Class Prostate Cancer Support List. The intent has been to develop an active group to provide information and support to those of us in the class who become afflicted with PC and to those wanting to learn more about how to prevent it in the first place. Naturally, non-cancerous prostate issues such as BPH or enlarged prostates are fair game as well. And with a flexible charter, we are free to go in whatever directions we feel a need for.

The true success of the group is highly dependent upon our ability to communicate freely and openly with each other. But the issues we deal with are often very personal and highly sensitive in nature. They include, but are by no means limited to external assaults upon our masculinity, even our mortality. Therefore, confidentiality and sensitivity are the very cornerstones of our program. Personal issues stay within the group and we are very mindful and respectful of each other's feelings and needs.

The group grew rapidly to just over a hundred, or a quarter of our living classmates and former classmates. Of those, 24 have been diagnosed with PC from as early on as 1993 and as recently as this year. Surprised? Don't be! There are probably a few more still out there, and regretfully, more to come in the future. This is an issue that most people just don't like to talk openly about. But there are 22 list members who have been afflicted with PC and have courageously and selflessly identified themselves to the group and have availed themselves on a one-on-one basis to provide counsel and assistance to those who become afflicted and want help from those who have been there, done that. And the system really works. I've seen it in action. We as a class really owe these 22 guys a great deal. We on the list are very proud of them.

And on the flip side, those who have identified themselves as PC afflicttees have certainly been appreciative of the emotional support they have received from close friends and concerned classmates.

PC has already claimed the lives of two of our classmates, Kevin Brown in 1988 and Jud Ellis in 2001. Others are busy fighting for their lives. Many others have succeeded in getting their afflictions under control.
