REUNIONS AND MINI-REUNIONS FOR THE YEAR 2004 AND BEYOND.

There is only one reunion or mini reunion scheduled each year. 2009 is tentatively in Tucson, AZ with Art Meyer in Charge or in Huntsville AL with Point Ray Coffey(Note that all the mini reunions after 2005 are tentative and they may be switched around as the situation dictates)

USMA CLASS OF 1968 PERPETUAL ENDOWMENT AND CLASS GIFT.

Our Class has already funded the First Class Club, and this has been a very successful, high profile, gift by our class to the Academy. The First Class Club is probably more appreciated by the cadets than any other class gift to the Academy, and we are rightly proud of that gift. In addition to that, we are trying to make the Perpetual Endowment have more impact on the occasion of our 50th reunion and beyond.

To restate our 50th Anniversary Gift project: The Class Executive Committee established the goal to increase the value of the Endowment to \$580,000 by the 50th anniversary of our graduation. A suggested donation was not set; however, if every living Classmate were to contribute an additional \$900 to the fund over the next six years, the Class goal would be attained. At our 50th, the Supe will be presented with a very large (in physical size - - 1.5 feet by 4 feet) check, dated 4 June 2058, (note date carefully) in the amount of 25 percent of the Endowment's "2058" estimated value - - calculated at an annual growth rate of 8 percent. If we succeed in this campaign, our \$580,000 will grow to \$27.2 million in 2058. Therefore, our check to the Supe would be in the amount of \$6.8 million!

At the current donation rate (based upon this year's contributions), we will reach our goal in 5.9 years. We hope to reach our goal in 4 years.

The "Prince Igor" auction brought in \$8,000 to our fund.

PLEBE MARCH BACK: Fifty two classmates (a new Record!) participated in the March Back with the Class of 2008 on August 9 – 10 to commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of our own Plebe Hike.

CLASS RINGS. By now most of us are well aware of the Class Ring Memorial project that our own Ron Turner suggested to West Point and the AOG, which is now up and running, and part of West Point's important customs and traditions. Our class is one of largest providers of class rings, which are then melted down and mixed with gold for new rings for future classes.

Over the years stolen, and lost West Point Class Rings have appeared on "Ebay" and other places for sale, and Bill O'Neil and other members of the Class of 1992 instituted a program to recover these rings and return them to their owners, their heirs, and the West Point Community. Their most recent report indicates they recovered from "Ebay" sellers five rings of various classes in the first quarter of this year (2004).

One of these recovered rings is also of special significance to the Class of 1958 because it also brings the two Ring projects together. An unidentified Class of 1920 ring, recovered on 6 March 2004 was presented by "Ring Recovery" to the Class of 2006. This ring was then delivered to the Association of Graduates where it joined the Class Ring Memorial Program. It will be melted in March 2005 in preparation for the manufacture of the rings of the Class of 2006 and beyond.

Cadet Barnard will graduate in May and enter active duty as an Infantry officer. Georgetown University ROTC is made up from students from Georgetown and other area Universities. The Military Ball was a most energetic and enthusiastic experience in the format of a "Formal Dining-In" complete with Mr. Vice and a lot of visits to the Grog Bowl by selected Cadets who were allegedly guilty of various protocol infractions. Serchak, (USA-Ret.) presented the award to Alpha Company. The Capelle Memorial Trophy honors Captain Gerald C. Capelle who was killed in action in Vietnam on April 1, 1965. This year's graduation and award ceremonies included a parade & review of the cadet candidates with music provided by the West Point Band.

In addition to the trophy, the class of 1958 also provides funds for a "pizza party" for all members of the winning company. The USMAPS Commandant, Lt. Col. Mark English and Alpha Company Tactical Officer, Captain Lindsay, both expressed their sincere appreciation to the Class of 1958 for its continued interest and support of USMAPS. Captain Lindsay said that he intends to write a letter of appreciation to the Class of 1958, in that regard.

Joan (Capelle) was accompanied to Ft. Monmouth by her husband, John Vande Castle from their home in Fond du Lac, Wisconsin. This was the first presentation of the Capelle Trophy by a member of the Capelle family, since the inception of the award in 1972. Colonel (USA-Ret.) Hugh & Mrs. Ann Trumbull and Mrs. Edna Mae Serchak observed the presentation at the post parade field along with several hundred parents and friends of the 189 graduating Cadet Candidates. GEORGE WALKER AWARD: The George Walker Award for debate excellence was presented by Tom Carpenter to Cadet Elliot B. Press and Cadet Adam A. Scher on Thursday, May 27th in Thayer Hall.
