Message from ExCom Chairman, Palmer McGrew: "The Great Class of 1958 continues to show the way for the rest of the Long Gray Line. Our reunions are magnificent, our minis are maxis, our class gift is the best there is, our marchers set a new record last fall and our record of community service is unique. It was a Class initiative that finally pushed TRICARE FOR LIFE out of committee and into reality. Having used this benefit many times, I can testify that it is a remarkable one.

"We can never say "thanks" often enough to the many volunteers who help make the Class of '58 so special. Thanks! We are all in your debt.

"Now, we have an opportunity to do something for our wounded soldiers who, in many cases, face a daunting future. Imagine a soldier who lost his legs to a car bomb in Iraq, has an incomplete education, few non-military skills, and does not have a supportive family to assist him or her in establishing a new life. The future is frightening, the feeling of abandonment is strong, and the need for help is great.

"We have agreed with the Help Our Heroes Foundation to provide mentor/advocates for some of these severely wounded soldiers, especially those who have passed out of Walter Reed and been relocated to facilities outside the DC area. We are also helping soldiers here, but we will be asking many of you to volunteer in this effort throughout the rest of the country. Please do volunteer in this important effort. It's the least we can do for these men and women who have given so much for their country."

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO HELP WALTER REED INJURED AND DISABLED: As Palmer McGrew noted in his opening letter, the Class of 1958 Executive Committee is working with the Help Our Heroes Foundation (HOHF) to provide mentoring assistance to disabled patients being treated at Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington, DC. Bob Tredway has taken the lead in this important undertaking. The plan is to put a network of mentor/advocates/big brothers in place across the U.S. These classmates/volunteers will become follow-on mentor/advocates when patients depart Walter Reed and return home or are placed in other military or civilian hospitals outside the Washington, DC area. The concept is to link the soldier with a volunteer residing in the vicinity of the soldier's new location. However, volunteers are needed now here in the Washington, DC area.
