- b. Class Grandsons: George Sibert noted that we now have three Grandsons in the Corps: Michael J Hill '07 (Paul Bons C1), Charles Maliska'10, (Tom Maliska, E2), and Tom Moentmann '10 (son Jim Moentmann '81 and grandson of Bud, C1). At the recent ExCom meeting, Tony Smith was given the task of coming up with an appropriate graduation gift from our class for approximately \$100 each.
- c. Nominating Distinguished Graduates from our Class: George Lawton has noted that the “Distinguished Class of 1958” has not yet had a member of the class selected for the honor of Distinguished Graduate. The process of nominating appears to be more assured of success if the nominating documents include strong endorsements from the Class as a whole and from a number of the local chapters of the West Point Alumni Societies. The matter will be discussed by the ExCom, but the seed needs to be planted throughout the class for suggestions and to initiate nominations.

7. First Class Club

- a. Tony Smith, our Class Representative on the AOG Advisory Council and the Class Liaison to the First Class Club (FCC), visited the FCC twice this spring with the new Cadet Activities Officer, LTC Flowers, to assess the condition of the Club. Dale Hruby subsequently made a detailed inspection of the FCC. Tony and Dale reported that the condition of the FCC has gone downhill over the past several years. In general, they described the appearance of the FCC as shabby. The restrooms are particularly bad. Jack Bradshaw, who visited the FCC last summer, concurred with this assessment of the Club's appearance.
- b. The Executive Committee agreed unanimously that the Class should make every effort to bring the FCC up to a “first class” standard by the time that the class of 2008 begins to use the Club (August 2007). The Committee decided to seek a meeting with high-level USMA officials to enhance our partnership with West Point and to clarify our respective responsibilities for maintaining and improving the Club.

8. Mentoring Class of 2008: The great Class of 1958 has taken seriously our mentoring role in developing the Class of 2008 and in building a strong link with them beginning with their swearing in and a great showing for their Marchback from the Plebe Hike two years ago. Last year at Buckner, Al Salisbury represented the class presenting them with their Class Flag. Now, as they transition from Yearlings to Cows, the pace will pick up.

- a. Class Coin Project, Fall of 2006: On August 13, the Class of 2008 will participate in the Affirmation Ceremony affirming their commitment to serve the nation for two more years as cadets and to fulfill their military obligation as officers in the U.S. Military Services. As a symbol of this affirmation, each member of the Class who takes that step will receive at the ceremony a coin designed by Al Salisbury and purchased by our class. The coin displays the Class of 2008 Crest on one side and the Crest of the class of 1958 on the other.
- b. Marchback for Plebe Hike, 6 August 2006: The Class of 2008 will be serving as Beast Barracks Squad

leaders for the Plebe hike Marchback which begins Sunday evening, 6 August. We only have three marchers, Will Collett, Wally Ward and Ed Weckel - - same as last year for the long march. We know of no 2 milers from our Class this year.

- c. Marchback for Plebe Hike, August 2007: As Firsties and Cadet Officers, the Class of 2008 will lead the Plebe Hike Marchback in August 2007. Fifty-three of our classmates marched along with them when they were Plebes, hopefully we can get a great turn out for their final Plebe Hike. Ed Weckel will keep us informed and coordinate this effort as he has in the past.
- d. FCC Turnover to Class of 2008, August 2007: At the end of August 2007, the class of 2007 will pass responsibility for the First Class Club to our protégés, the Class of 2008. Hopefully all repairs and upgrades discussed above by Tony Smith will have been achieved and our pride and joy will be presented to the Class of 2008 in "First Class" shape. As always, Bob Pointer will be coordinating the Changeover Ceremony with the Cadet Class Officers and the Cadet Activities Officer. This will be another great opportunity to reach out and touch the class of 2008 and solidify our relationship. Put it on your calendar.
- e. Butter Bars (?) in 2008 – In the recent past, it has become the custom for the 50 year reunion class to provide each graduating cadet with a set of Second Lieutenant gold bars to represent the Long Grey Line linkage between the classes. The recent announcement by the Department of the Army that the Green uniform will be phased out has raised questions regarding the future of metal insignia of rank in an Army that only has field uniforms (BDUs) and Blue Dress uniforms. It is speculated that the Beret headgear will continue to sport the metal insignia of rank, but that has not been confirmed. Hopefully this will be resolved before May 2008.

9. **Permanent Endowment Fund (PEF)**

- a. Report from the PEF Board: The Directors of the PEF report that our Class Perpetual Endowment is now worth over \$500k - -\$521,392 (on 1 April 2006) to be exact. Amount invested was \$368k. Contributions are still being accepted to this fund. Questions should be addressed to members of the Endowment Board - either Pete Brintnall, M-2, (Chairman), Lee Miller, A-1 or John Evans, E-1.
- b. Call for Nominations: The Secretary of the PEF, John Evans, E-1, has asked that we include in this Newsletter a "Solicitation for Nominations..." to replace Pete Brintnall who will reach the end of his six year term on the board. This document is included at the conclusion of the Newsletter. Nominations are due NLT 15 August.

10. **Activities since the Last Newsletter(Feb 2006)**

- a. Rosemont Raceway: George Lawton, G-2 coordinated an outing on 10 June for classmates and wives to Rosemont Raceway, in Fort Washington, Maryland for an evening of dining and betting on the trotters. A great time was had by all.
- b. Groves Memorial Golf Center: The Groves Golf Center was dedicated on 7 April 06. The center was funded by Dick and Margaret Groves. The center itself is not completed, but will have a putting green and chipping green inside, as well as showers, locker room, storage, and a small office for the coach. A must see at our 50th! Attending from Dick's company, K-1. were Sands, Shrader, Trumbull, and Turner. Other classmates were Graves, Parks, and Will Roosma.
- c. Memorial Ceremony for Bob Degen: A large number of Classmates, wives and friends joined the Degen family and a great turnout of D-2 files in a ceremony at the Vietnam Memorial on May 21st to honor Bob Degen who was killed in Vietnam. After reminiscences and remarks, a memorial wreath was laid at the wall near where Bob's name is inscribed. Most of the group then adjourned to the Army-Navy Country Club for comradeship and brunch. Next year's ceremony will honor Dave Nidever, L-2.
- d. WW II/ Battle of the Bulge Program at 8 February Class Luncheon: Dusty Rhodes presented a moving and inspirational talk and video account of his visit last year to the "Battle of the Bulge" site as escort officer to a large group of WWII veterans of that historic battle. Dusty was joined on the rostrum by WWII Army Nurse, an Army Air Corps C-47 pilot, and Gen Knowlton all of whom participated in the battle. They told their stories to a rapt audience.
- e. Cadet Glee Club Concerts in Washington, DC, March 10 & 11: On Friday, March 10th, Cadet Glee Club conducted a concert at the Kennedy Center on the "Millennium Stage." On Saturday evening (March 11th) they performed a concert in the Coolidge Auditorium at the Library of Congress (LOC). Alan Salisbury played a key role in setting these programs up. The second concert was in support of the LOC's "Veterans History Project" which is a very exciting project in the process of collecting oral histories from veterans of any and all wars, with current emphasis on WWII for obvious reasons. (Dusty Rhodes is involved in this project.) Classmates were involved in housing Cadets as well as providing transportation and assistance to patients attending from Walter Reed and Bethesda.
- f. Election and Luncheon: (April 20). Tony Smith was elected unanimously to fill the ExCom vacancy created by the retirement of John Herren, who completed six years of dedicated service on the ExCom.

- g. Malone Award: (May 5). Bob Tredway, M-2, represented the Class of '58 in making the presentation of the Malone Award to the most outstanding "Cadet Ranger," in the graduating Georgetown University ROTC unit at the annual military ball at Ft. Meyer Officer's Club.
- h. Savannah Mini: (May 14-17). Rube Waddell and Jae Stanton and their families can take credit for putting on "The Mother of All Mini's," not only because it was a top rate event but because they held it on Mothers' Day weekend in beautiful and historic downtown Savannah.
- i. Cappelle Award: (May 18). Hugh Trumbull, K-1, represented the Class at the annual graduation and awards ceremonies at the USMA Prep School, Ft. Monmouth, NJ. Alpha Company won the Capelle Memorial Trophy this year. Cadet Candidate Company Commander Joseph L. Cabrera accepted the trophy on behalf of his company. CC Cabrera hails from a small town in West Texas. His father came up through the ranks in the Army and retired as a Warrant Officer. Having his son go to West Point has been a dream of his. Pressure!?? The new Commandant, COL Tyge Rugenstein, commented in his speech and personally to Hugh how much the support of the Graduates means to the Prep School. He also indicated that the potential move of the Prep School to West Point was "an unfunded requirement" and was not imminent. They expect little change at Ft. Monmouth before 2010 or 2011 at the earliest. The single thing that impressed Hugh most was the number of right shoulder patches there were in this graduating group!
- j. Walker Award: (May 25). Tom Carpenter, M-2, made the presentation of the George Walker Memorial award to two outstanding Cadet Debaters, Ryan Sullivan (ADA, headed to Fort Bragg for his first assignment with his new bride) and Allison Pan (selected to go to Hawaii for a year long fellowship)..
- k. Ramsden Award: (May 25). The annual award to the outstanding Chemistry Student given in memory of Jim Ramsden was presented at the awards convocation in Thayer Hall during graduation week. The winner of the 2006 Ramsden award was Laura McGinnis from Centerville, Ohio. Her branch is Aviation.
- l. Civil War Staff Ride: On July 27, Herb Puscheck and Jack Downing coordinated a visit by approximately 16 classmates and friends to the Surratt House which was on John Wilkes Booth's escape route. They enjoyed lunch the Wayfarer Restaurant.
