We have had some requests for the flag for wives' ceremonies and have been able to honor those requests since there were no competing requests for <u>Classmate</u> ceremonies. The Flag, less the flag staff and Reunion Streamers, is sent by overnight mail. We have had great success getting the flag to these events, provided we get timely notification. ExCom Meeting – 22 September 2009 At their meeting on 22 September 2009, the Executive Committee (ExCom) elected Jim Hall to replace Palmer McGrew as Chairman of the ExCom to be effective subsequent to the Class Meeting at the Mini Reunion in Tucson. They also approved a recommended change to the Class Bylaws to extend eligibility for membership on the ExCom to the entire class regardless of their geographic location. This change will be voted upon by those present at the class meeting in Tucson. The proposed Bylaw changes are enclosed (Enclosure #1) to this newsletter. Any classmates not attending the Tucson Reunion are encouraged to vote by contacting the ExCom Secretary, John Raymond prior to 21 October. If the change is approved by a majority of those voting as required by our class Constitution, then the process for securing nominations for filling vacancies as they occur will include the Nominating Committee's publishing an announcement soliciting nominations or volunteers. The election of the new member would then be conducted at the next class meeting, as the Constitution requires.

Survey of Class Concerning the Forum: Because of a significant drop in participation in our Class Forum on the Internet, a survey, developed by Hal Lyon, Stan Bacon and Jim Seltzer, was administered by the ExCom to develop an understanding of this phenomenon. Of the 440 classmates and widows receiving the survey notification by e-mail, 236 responded—more than half. Of the 166 mail-outs, seven responded for a total of 243 responses. Enclosure #1: Proposed changes to the Class of 1958 Bylaws:

BY-LAWS
OF THE
CLASS OF 1958
UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMY

SECTION I COMPOSITION OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee will be composed of at least five classmates. The Class President and Reporter (or Scribe) will be ex-officio members of the committee. The Executive Committee will organize itself with a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Treasurer and Secretary.

SECTION II ELECTION OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- A. The elective members of the Committee will be elected annually by a simple majority of the members of the Class present and voting at the Annual Class Meeting.
- B. Nominations will be accepted from any member of the Class..

SECTION III CLASS HEADQUARTERS

- A. The Executive Committee shall be located at a place designated as the Class Headquarters.
- B. West Point will serve initially and until changed as the Class Headquarters.
- C. Class Headquarters may be changed from time to time by the Class President (or ranking Permanent Class Officer) to reflect the shifting geographical location of the Class).

SECTION IV RESPONSIBILITIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- A. The Executive Committee will:
 - a. Coordinate and maintain continuous records of all class activities.
 - b. Maintain continuous records of the Class Fund and render a financial report annually in Assembly or in another publication, which will be sent to all class members for whom the class has an address.
 - c. Appoint a Class Reporter who will write the Class column for Assembly. It is not necessary that a new Reporter be appointed each year.
 - d. Establish procedures for the nomination and election of members to the Executive Committee.
 - e. As required, establish such committees as are required for the conduct of Class business.
 - f. Make all decisions for the Class except as otherwise indicated in this Constitution.
- B. Decisions of the Committee will be made by a simple majority, each member of the Committee having one vote.

AMENDMENT

These By-Laws may be amended in the same manner as the Constitution, as specified by Article VII of same.
