#### **Data-Base Reminder (Paul Ruud < ruud @ starband.net > )**

We ask each of you to review and update your personal data in the Class data base. Potential uses of the data base include the following: (1) We will not publish a 55<sup>th</sup> reunion book, so the database will be the most current source of information about you; (2) people writing memorial articles will be able to find information and an updated picture; (3) an updated data base will make the legacy of the Great Class of 1958 available for generations. If you have forgotten your password, follow the instructions to have it emailed to you. A critical part of the update is to insure that you have given classmates unrestricted access to your information. We'll ask CCQs to give a status report on their company in the days leading up to the Washington minireunion.

Some eye-opening statistics: Of 416 living classmates, 92 have not made ANY entry in the database, and 80 deceased classmates have no entries. An additional impediment to writers of memorial articles is that 37 classmates have designated their databases as "restricted from other classmates."

If you haven't done so, please update your database. Only 20 classmates have done so since publication of the 50-year reunion book.

### FCC Enhancements (Tony Smith < aasmith58@msn.com>)

We continue to work on finalizing plans for the retractable enclosure for the First Class Club (FCC) that will allow the patio to be used year-round and that will greatly increase the FCC's capacity. The vendor and engineers from the USMA Department of Public Works (DPW) met on-site just before the Christmas 2011. We have a revised proposal from the vendor reflecting the results of this meeting. DPW is currently reviewing that proposal. We are hoping to realize the same sort of joint effort between the class and the DPW that we achieved in the major FCC renovation that was completed prior to our 50th Reunion. DPW is operating, like all military facilities in these times of financial restraints, in a severe budget climate that may hinder their ability to support the project as generously as they did in 2007-2008."

The Class of 58 is proud of beginning the Wounded Warrior Mentor Program in 2004 at the old Walter Reed, now closed as a result of the BRAC. The program has grown to include programs at the new Walter Reed National Medical Center in Bethesda, Ft Belvoir and Ft Meade with 300 Wounded Warriors being mentored one on one by mostly combat veterans. Our mission remains to assist Wounded Warriors and their spouses to a new productive life and profession with a three to five year horizon. We are now a 501(c) 3 not-for-profit all volunteer organization with virtual offices and no budget, directed by an Executive Coordinating Committee with the mentors being supported by approximately 100 volunteer subject matter experts.

We are fully accepted by all the Warrior Transition Units (WTU) where we operate and work hand in hand with their cadre. Many of our Wounded Warriors now in the WTUs are ill and injured, and in many cases, less seriously wounded not requiring extensive and prolonged treatment and rehabilitation. As a result, we are working on a model to expose them to the opportunities available and then provide them with the knowledge to move forward in life on their own. Standby guidance will be available from our mentor teams as required. We are optimistically looking forward to the winding down

of OEF in a year or two. Until then, the Class of 58 will continue to provide the leadership and mentors for our program to assist Wounded Warriors and their spouses.
