The dedication to excellence with which we are both imbued. You four graduating '58 grandchildren know each other and I hope that friendship continues for the rest of your lives. Our class has that still. I don't mean for you to not form friendships outside your class, far from it, but periodically, I hope and expect your class to reunite and share memories as our class continues to do.

On the bottom of the plate is taped a copy of the Memorandum of Understanding between the class of 1958 and 2008, our 50-year class. It outlines a 100th year celebration to which you are cordially invited. No members of our class will be there so we will depend on our children and grandchildren to represent us. Please remember us. We will be there in spirit.

Accept this pewter plate as a token of our lasting friendship. Over the coming years it may become tarnished and forgotten, but never forget the bond we now establish."
