Subject: Annual Letter

The Bylaws of the Class of 1965, as amended on 3 July 2021, call for the Leadership Team to provide an annual report, this constitutes the 2022-23 report. The Leadership Team's normally meets on the even numbered months via Zoom. This year the schedule varied due to necessary discussions related to our upcoming 60th Reunion. Minutes are available for each meeting. Additionally, there were frequent exchanges of emails and phone calls.

Class Financial Status.

The Administrative Fund is the sole currently active fund from which class bills are paid, as of April 30, 2023, the fund held \$43,238. While that is \$14,000 more than a year ago our goal remains \$100,000. Thanks to all who contributed during the last year, for those who are ready to contribute the suggested contribution level is \$650. The Admin Fund covers the initial costs incurred for reunions, as well as class support for funerals of deceased classmates (flowers, or a \$200 charitable contribution in memory of the deceased and shipping of the class flag,) and any other incidental expenses. When the lights are turned off for the Class of 1965, remaining funds will revert to AOG to a fund we designate. The Leadership Team has not yet designated the recipient fund, but we have time as we are not near the date for hitting the light switch. We have four class endowments. The financial data shown below reflect current levels as made available by AOG.

• The Class of 1965 Maintenance Endowment funds the maintenance of the Arvin Alcove, Thayer Walk Memorial, and the Class Forum at Jefferson

Library. Balance: \$117,157, with \$4,743 available for disbursement in 2023. No disbursements were required in 2022.

- The Harry Dermody '65 Summer Leaders Experience Scholar Endowment covers personal expenses for one summer experience scholar each year. Balance: \$50,196, available for disbursement \$2,334. It is interesting to note that Kailey Bacon, who was the recipient of the scholarship last summer, is now a member of the Class of 2027. Harry would be proud!
- The Harry Dermody '65 Cadet Public Relations Council Endowment covers the cost for a cadet each year to travel to Massachusetts to speak to potential WP candidates. The endowment current balance is \$63,129 with current expenditure of \$2,672 for 2023.
- You may recall The Bob Jones '65 Fallen Graduates Memorial Scholarship Endowment was changed last Fall and is now the Bob Jone'65 Fallen Graduates Memorial Quasi Endowment mirroring the Gripping Hands Endowment and supplies educational benefits to families of those killed or wounded in the line of duty and provides aid to families of graduates in "times of trouble" without defining every trouble. Balance: \$514,307, annual available disbursement \$20,467

Past recipients of the Marshall Medal include Generals of the Army Dwight Eisenhower and Omar Bradley; Presidents Harry Truman, Gerald Ford, and George H.W. Bush you are in excellent company Ric!
- <u>AOG Advisory Council.</u> The Leadership Team selected Jack Jannarone to represent the class on AOG's Advisory Council; Jack will serve until 31 December 2025. It is the last time the class will be invited to provide a member.
- Golf. Golf Outings have become fewer as we age. That said, there is an event scheduled for the Ocean City, MD area from 17 21 September. There has been an impressive response for a group of Octogenarians with twenty-four Classmates (both golfers and non-golfers) committing to attend.
