GUIDED TOUR

Tour leaves the Thayer Hotel Thursday morning and visits both of the places below. Approximate cost per person is \$22 plus bus fee. Lunch will be on your own at Springwood.

SPRINGWOOD: The home of Franklin D. Roosevelt. Tour the mansion, and also visit the Presidential Library and Museum.

VANDERBILT MANSION AT HYDE PARK: The Vanderbilt Mansion, in terms of architecture, interiors, mechanical systems, road systems and landscape, is a remarkably complete example of a gilded-age country place, illustrating the political, economic, social, cultural, and demographic changes that occurred as America industrialized in the years after the Civil War.

SCAVENGER HUNT

For those adventurous souls, there will be a scavenger hunt at West Point on Thursday. Departing from the Thayer Hotel in teams of 4, you will scour West Point for clues and items, bringing your swag back to the Thayer. Winners will be announced on Friday. Selection is entirely up to the capriciousness of the judges.

TOURS ON YOUR OWN

In case you have spare time and would like to visit some sites other than those included in our “formal” tour on Thursday, below are some suggestions.

CADET STORE: Open 8-4 Monday-Friday. In Building 606, located in New South area behind where old hospital (now Mahan Hall) was located. You can buy anything (including parkas and bathrobes) but uniform items. They accept Visa, MasterCard and cash.

PHILIPSBURG MANOR: Departure point for Kykuit, and worth a tour on its own.

UNION CHURCH OF POCANTICO HILLS: Close to Philipsburg Manor. Stained glass windows by Henri Matisse and Marc Chagall.

CONSTITUTION ISLAND: Tours leave from the West Point South Dock at 1 and 2 PM every Wednesday and Thursday. 845-446-8676.

WEST POINT FOUNDRY PRESERVE: Located at the end of Kemble Avenue in Cold Spring. The Foundry played a major role in the Civil War and the industrial development of the Hudson Valley. Currently undergoing archaeological exploration.
