NEW MEETING LOCATION

Beginning with the February 10, 2008 meeting, WPPCGH meetings will be held at the University of St. Thomas – 2nd Floor of the Jerabeck Activity and Athletic Center (Building 30) located at 4000 Mount Vernon Houston, TX 77006.
