

Notes, cards and letters are especially welcome to help our soldiers know that those of us at home are grateful and are supporting their efforts. Be sure in sending boxes that you do not send any pork products, anything that could be construed as pornographic by a Muslim inspector (yes, that would include Sports Illustrated's swimsuit issue), religious materials of any type, or - in this time of year - any food items that might melt.
