


WEST POINT PARENTS' CLUB OF THE TEXAS PLAINS July 2003

<u>**1LT John Thurman**</u> is on his way home from duty in Iraq. John is enroute to West Point where he has been assigned to serve in the Admissions Dept. as the Outreach Officer for the Southwest Region. Welcome home, John!

Muff Fregia sends the following report on Justin, also serving in Iraq: Justin's Troop with the 3rd Armored Cavalry has been in western Iraq near the Syrian border for about 6 weeks. They have spent a small amount of time on a humanitarian mission (helping to restore a water supply) in a small town, but have mostly been in Al Qa'im (think Mos Isley Cantina, Star Wars fans) There's been less frequent violence there than in the interior, but a member of Justin's troop was killed at the checkpoint early in June. Justin's troop was involved in the convoy attack the night of June 18. It was a busy night for Justin! Letters have taken up to 5 weeks, but packages are getting through in half that time now and snacks relieve the tedium of MRE's! He has requested that we send ice, ice cream, air conditioning, and flushing toilets! He said he was celebrating his 3rd anniversary of graduation from USMA with tuna fish and Easy Cheese on Harvest Crisps - and there are other high points - they are near the Euphrates River and get to take some showers!

Muff reported that USMA graduate $\underline{\textbf{LT Brad McBrayer}}$ is also serving in Iraq.
