

DISTINGUISHED GRADUATE AWARD CRITERIA

1. Distinguished service in keeping with the Academy motto. (Consider military service, active, Guard or Reserve, as well as other public (federal, state, local, community) sector service. Likewise, consider work in the business or private sector, profit or nonprofit, which draws wholesome comparison to qualities in keeping with the values of West Point.)
2. Stature. (Consider the level of distinction and extent (national, state, local) of prominence, standing or acclaim attained in military or civilian (profit or nonprofit) service or work; or within a particular field of endeavor or interest, including that of a philanthropic or charitable nature.)
3. Character. (Consider leadership and reputation that draw wholesome comparison to the Academy's aims in developing and fostering leaders of character.)
4. Demonstrated interest in supporting West Point. (Consider degree of involvement in or contributions to activities aimed at supporting the Academy and the Corps of Cadets. Examples include, but are not limited to, youth leadership development, admissions, cadet activities, AOG activities, societies, and parents' clubs; as well as special committees, panels and seminars; and endowments and donations to West Point, AOG, societies, etc.)
